PARISH SCHOOL with AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Though rooted in the Catholic Tradition our enrollment is open to all who seek Pre-School-eighth grade education. The faculty and staff are dedicated to meeting the academic, emotional, social, and spiritual needs of our children as well as their families. PTU and the School Advancement Team (SAT) are active ways for parents to be informed and involved.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION (PSR)

First through eighth grade students enrolled in the public school system meet weekly during the school year to develop a deeper understanding of our Catholic faith, teachings, and traditions.

BAPTISM PREPARATION

These sessions are offered periodically throughout the year for those parents who seek to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith.

HOLY FAMILY PROGRAM

The Holy Family Program is the family-based Sacramental program for those children preparing for the reception of Reconciliation and Eucharist for the first time.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION

This process of preparation is offered to any young person who would like to be fully initiated into the Catholic Faith through the Sacrament of Confirmation. After meeting with the Director of Religious Education, a program is designed that is mutually agreeable.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (VBS)

VBS is a week-long summer program for children in 4 year-old preschool - 6th grade. Throughout the week children learn Scripture stories, make crafts, sing and dance, share fun snacks, and pray together.

ST. BRENDAN PARISH YOUTH GROUP (SPY)

We gather the youth of our parish in a healthy, appropriate venue to meet new people, deepen friendships and come closer to God. We encourage active participation in the life and work of the parish community.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION

Couples who seek marriage in the Church should contact a parish priest so that information can be given to help prepare and organize for the marriage six months in advance.

PRE-CANA MARRIAGE DAY

Part of marriage preparation is to spend a day focusing on the meaning of a life-long, loving, faith commitment to each other. This day is led by married couples and is a great opportunity to listen from their wisdom and experience and to reflect on your own outlook and vision for the future with each other.



ADULT EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Continues the discussion and development of adult, faith-based education of our community.

ART CLASS

Develop the creative side. This class is offered periodically throughout the year to bring color and inspiration to life.

BIBLE STUDY

Classes are offered by educated instructors periodically throughout the year on different books of Scripture.

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

This group meets to discuss, pray, and build awareness of the social teachings of the Church and to actively respond to the current social issues of our modern day society.

WELLNESS MINISTRY

This ministry provides opportunity for area hospitals to network with our parish community in facilitating timely information and awareness on health care issues. They also provide blood pressure and cholesterol screening at designated times during the year. Active/retired medical care professionals in our parish facilitate this group.

HOLY NAME SOCIETY

They promote the Holy Name of Jesus and the presence of Christ in the parish. They support and encourage Catholic education and our parish programs.

ALTAR AND ROSARY SOCIETY

They provide for the needs of the church sanctuary, encourages devotion to Mary through the praying of the rosary, supports a spirit of Christian friendship and service within the parish community.

GOLDEN NAVIGATORS

This is a social group of parishioners who are 50 years or older. They support friendship among each other and organize times to come together for faith sharing, bus trips, education, and fun.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

This is a body of elected parishioners who consult with the pastor on the pastoral needs of the parish community.

FINANCE COUNCIL

This is a body of parishioners chosen by the pastor for their financial and managerial expertise. They consult with the pastor on matters of being a good steward of the parish resources.

NEWS FROM THE PEWS

This is our weekly parish bulletin that is designed and organized by an editor from the parish community. The deadline for bulletin articles is Mondays at Noon. They should be submitted to the parish office. The News From The Pews may be viewed online from our website as well.

Our parish website is yet another face of our parish community that reaches out to those who are looking to stay current, or find out more about our life of faith.

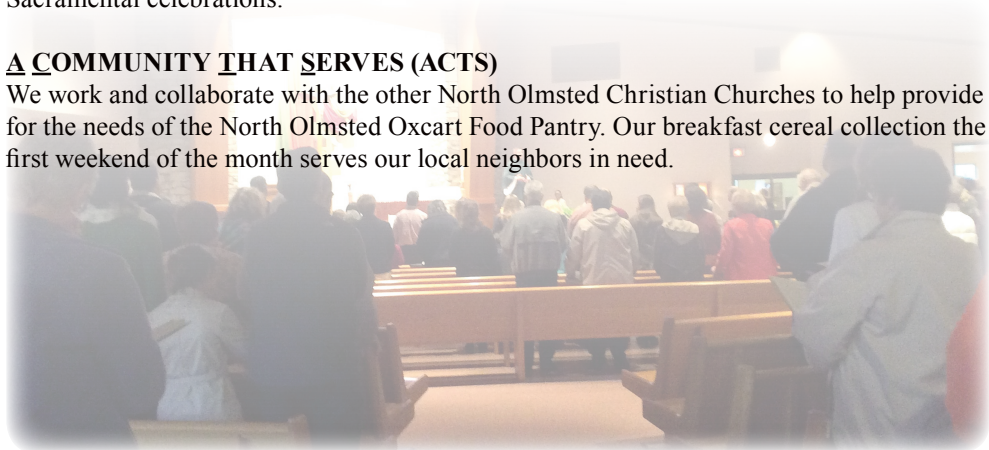

VIBRANT PARISH LIFE/CLUSTERING

We work and collaborate with the other North Olmsted Catholic Churches, St. Clarence and St. Richard. Throughout the year we help each other with various programs and Sacramental celebrations.

A COMMUNITY THAT SERVES (ACTS)

We work and collaborate with the other North Olmsted Christian Churches to help provide for the needs of the North Olmsted Oxcart Food Pantry. Our breakfast cereal collection the first weekend of the month serves our local neighbors in need.



THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (R.C.I.A.)

This is a process in which adults who would like to join our Catholic Faith are able to walk and talk with other members of the parish community in order to gradually inquire and deepen a commitment to Christ as lived through the Catholic Tradition.

OUTREACH TO THE HOSPITALIZED

When you or a family member are hospitalized for an extended stay, contact the parish office for prayer support. Because of confidentiality codes, hospitals do not contact parishes when a parishioner is admitted. Every hospital has a full-time Catholic priest who is on call and ministers to the needs of those admitted.

OUTREACH TO AREA NURSING HOMES

We have a ministry to Manor Care Nursing Home and O'Neill Healthcare facility in North Olmsted. Eucharistic Ministers take communion to residents on a weekly basis. We have mass at Manor Care on the third Wednesday of each month and at O'Neill Healthcare facility on the second Friday of each month. If you know of any parishioners located at other nursing homes, please inform the office so that periodic visits can be scheduled.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK & RECONCILIATION

To request the anointing of the sick or reconciliation, see a priest or call the parish office to arrange a time. Confession is also available every Saturday from 3:30 PM - 4:30PM.

FUNERAL ASSISTANCE

In time of death, the parish priests and staff will work with the family to help make arrangements for the Rite of Christian Burial (the Funeral Mass). We also provide a parish-coordinated luncheon or space for a catered luncheon in the Kenny Center after the committal at the cemetery. Family or the funeral home should contact the parish office.

BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

Periodically those who have lost a loved one are invited to come together for prayer to help ease those times of the year that can be most difficult. The parish can provide resources with regard to bereavement groups that meet on a regular basis.

PRAYER CHAIN


This is a group of parishioners who are alerted to pray for the special needs of the parish and individual concerns of parishioners. Contact the parish office so that members of the chain can be notified about prayer intentions. A book of Prayer Intentions is also located in the vestibule of the church.

ANNULMENT MINISTRY

For those who wish to know more about the Church's teaching on divorce and annulments should contact a parish priest. He will also help facilitate the reconciliation and healing process that the annulment fosters.

WESTSHORE SEPARATED, DIVORCED, WIDOWED CATHOLIC SUPPORT GROUP

This group is open to anyone who has been married at one time but is now living a single life because of divorce, separation, or death of a spouse. This is a ministry of peers who come together to help each other adjust emotionally, socially, and psychologically. Meetings happen on the first, third, and fifth Sunday of each month at 7:00 PM.

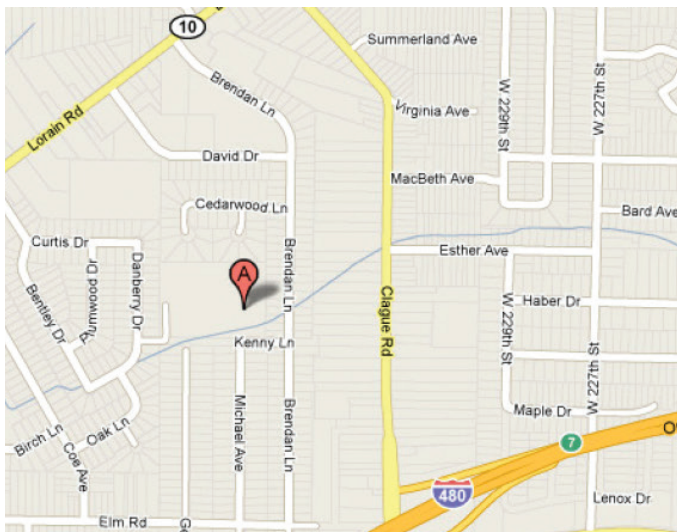
OUR MISSION and OUR PRAYER
