Back in 2018 Pope Francis, placed this memorial on the Universal Calendar of the Church for the all us to grow in our understanding and maturity of Mary's role within the life of the Church and our lives.

It is said, "if we want to grow and to be filled with the love of God, it is necessary to plant our life firmly on three great realities: the Cross, the Eucharist, and the Mother of God." (Cardinal Robert Sarah)
